## AT A GLANCE beach life

≺ Hôtel Les Roches Rouges, on the FRENCH
RIVIERA, ticks all the laid-back boxes. There are
wooden huts and lookout points and one of the
most beguiling seawater pools. The early Sixties
structure has been stripped back to its modernist
essentials and refashioned in simple, stylish white
(pictured). The SEYCHELLES island of Félicité
is now home to Six Senses Zil Pasyon - lavish but
subtle, with 30 villas secreted within a lush landscape. The spa opens this year. In SRILANKA,
George Cooper, owner of Kahanda Kanda near
Galle, has launched KK Beach, a bright, modern,
six-suite hotel on the edge of the ocean. The hotly
anticipated Miavana opens imminently on the
island of Nosy Ankao, off the north-eastern tip of

MADAGASCAR (South African dream team Silvio Rech and Lesley Carstens are behind the design). And talking of private islands, check out Cempedak and Bawah in INDONESIA, two new far-flung outposts of boho chic not far from Singapore. In nearby BALI, get ready for Echo Beach from the stylish Como Hotels. On ST BARTHS, colourful, characterful Villa Marie has opened above Flamands Bay, and on the gloriously pretty GRENADINE island of Canouan, glamorous Pink Sands Club has arrived. London grande dame Dukes has exported a touch of St James's glamour to DUBAI with its beachside hotel on the Palm Jumeirah, where a 'womenonly' floor is decked out in Liberty fabrics
